Program connects low income Kansas families online



The Affordable Connectivity Program ("ACP") is a new, long-term Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program that is replacing the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program (EBB program) effective January 1, 2022.

If your household is <u>eligible</u>, you can receive:

- Up to a \$30/month discount on your internet service
- Up to a \$75/month discount if your household is on qualifying Tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (with a co-payment of more than \$10 but less than \$50)

Only one monthly service discount and one device discount is allowed per household.

To receive the connected device discount, consumers need to enroll in the ACP with a <u>participating provider that offers connected devices</u> (Note: not all internet company offer device discounts.) The internet company will provide the discount to the consumer.
