

Only 25 percent of Kansas Homeowner Assistance Funds remain



Kansas homeowners in need of assistance encouraged to apply now

The [Kansas Homeowner Assistance Fund \(KHAF\)](#), a federally funded, temporary emergency program to support homeowners experiencing hardship during the COVID pandemic, has given out 75 percent of program funds.

Since the program launched in April, 2022, KHAF has provided **\$34,946,068 to 3,151 households.**

With a quarter of funds still available, homeowners in need of assistance are encouraged to apply now while there are still funds.

"I was stressed and overwhelmed when I got behind on my mortgage payments," said one KHAF applicant. "With so much going on in my life, I

was hesitant to get started applying. However, I learned that the application process was much easier than I thought.

My advice to others is to apply now; don't wait. If you need help, you can always call a KHAF customer service representative."

KHAF was established with American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to help qualifying Kansas homeowners get current on their mortgage payments and avoid foreclosure.

Eligible homeowners at least 30 days past-due on mortgage and/or property taxes can receive payment assistance for mortgages, utility bills, property taxes, and other charges associated with delinquency.
