Helpline staff give free legal assistance to children in foster care, nonparent members of their families and others including guardians ad litem, social workers, foster or pre-adoptive parents, attorneys, and prosecutors. Staff help remove barriers to permanent placements. They also assist persons in grasping and navigating the complex issues of child welfare law.

Helpline staff also counsel on legal issues related to children suffering from a disability, special education, mental and medical health referrals, education decisions, emancipation, independent living, and adoption.
