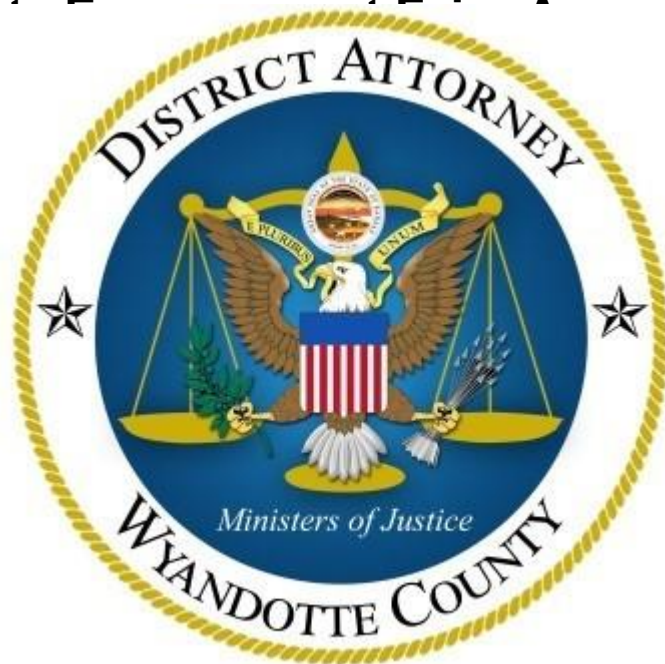

The Wyandotte County District Attorney's Office will hold its **2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Expungement Fair** from August 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020 to August 21<sup>st</sup>, 2020, with assistance from Kansas Legal Services.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the fair will be virtual, as opposed to face-to-face.

The prescreening process is now underway. To get started, read the chart below to see if you are eligible for expungement.

Then, send an email to [DAexpungements@wycokck.org](mailto:DAexpungements@wycokck.org) with your name and date of birth to confirm your eligibility.

You can also call the Wyandotte County DA office at 913-573-2851 and ask to be prescreened. Appointments to complete your paperwork will then be set between the dates listed.

**Case is Paid Off**  
The case to be expunged cannot have any unpaid restitution, fines, fees, etc. It is VERY common to be unaware of outstanding court debt, even after release from supervision.  
**Call the court of conviction to double check your fines!**

**Waiting Period Has Expired**  
You must wait a certain number of years since the date the sentence was completed (usually the date you finished probation or parole). How long depends on the severity of the crime, and is usually 3 or 5 years. For some DUIs, it is 7 or 10 years.

**No Registration Requirement**  
The case to be expunged cannot have a current requirement to register on an offender database. This applies even if you have moved out of state to avoid registering.

**No New or Pending Felonies**  
You cannot have had any new felony convictions within the past two years. You also cannot have any felony charges pending against you.

**Expungeable Crime**  
**Under Kansas law, there are certain crimes which cannot be expunged.** Generally these are any crimes which involve sexual offenses, children, or murder/manslaughter.
