Get Health Care Coverage - Open Enrollment Until August 15

The Affordable Care Act (ACA), formally known as the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, and also known as Obamacare, is a United States federal statute enacted by the 111th United States Congress and signed into law by President Barack Obama on March 23, 2010.

You can **enroll in Marketplace health coverage** through August 15 due to the **coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) emergency**.

More people than ever before qualify for help paying for health coverage, even those who weren't eligible in the past. **Learn more about new, lower costs.**

You may also still be able to enroll for 2021 any time these two ways: with a **Special Enrollment Period** or through **Medicaid** or the **Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)**.

2 ways to get 2021 health insurance

With a Special Enrollment Period

- If you experience certain types of life changes — like losing health coverage, getting married, moving, or having a baby — you may qualify for a Special Enrollment Period to enroll in a Marketplace plan any time.
 - Start an application. If you already know you qualify, **start an application now** or **log into an existing account**.
 - Before you apply, you can preview 2021 plans and prices. **Answer a few questions** to see plans and estimated prices based on your income.
- **See life events that may qualify you for a Special Enrollment Period.**

Through Medicaid or the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)

- You can apply for free or low-cost coverage through Medicaid and CHIP any time, all year. If you qualify, you can enroll immediately.
