

What's the big deal??

- Since 2010 the IRS's workforce has shrunk by 17 % but the amount of work has increased by 19%
 - Last year the IRS only answer 11% of the phone calls they received from taxpayers
- Electronic Processing versus manual processing
 - As of late December, the IRS had 10.3 million unprocessed original individual returns



WHAT IS THE LOW-INCOME TAXPAYER CLINIC?

Info about LITC

Free assistance and representation

Tax issues/controversies, generally not tax preparation

Funded partially by grants from the IRS

Funding for IRS cases, but allows for state tax cases when paired with IRS cases

KEY 2021 TAX RULES

Filing Status Overview

Single not married with no dependents Married Filing Jointly
married and file a joint
return

Married Filing <u>Separately</u> married but file separate returns

Head of Household
not married, pay more than
half of household expenses
and have a qualifying child
or dependent

Qualifying Widow(er) with

Dependent Child spouse died in the last 3 years and you have a dependent child

Single Filer Standard Deduction= \$12,500

2021 Federal Tax Brackets

Filing Deadlines

Initial Deadline

18 Apr.

17 Oct.

Automatic first extension until October 17th if you request it

Consider Filing Even If Not Required

- Protection from identity theft
- o New credits that may result in you getting a refund
- o Recommendation: use direct deposit

Earned Income Tax Credit

- A refundable tax credit that is a percentage of your earned income
- Basic Requirements:
 - Over the age of 19 (or 24 if you are in school)- NO age limit
 - Earned taxable income
 - Valid Social Security Number
 - U.S. citizen or a resident alien
- Changes for 2021
 - Tripled amount of credit for filers without children (\$538 > \$1,502)
 - Increased credit amounts for those with children
 - Can use your 2019 earned income if higher
 - Higher incomes qualify, expanding who gets the credit

Child Tax Credit & Advance Payments

Expanded credit through The American Rescue Plan Act

- Refundable credit for up to \$3,200 per qualifying child aged 17 & under and \$3,600 per qualifying child 5 & under
- Advanced payments were sent out June-December 2021

Qualifying Child Definition

- Child (step, adopted or foster), grandchild, niece or nephew
- Child lived with taxpayer for more than ½ the year and did not provide own support
- Can be properly claimed as a dependent
- Child is a U.S. citizen, U.S. national or U.S. resident alien

Advance Payments

- Look out for Letter 6419- one per parent
- Must be reported on 2021 tax return for reconciliation
- Repayment protection plan
 - Single filer income of \$80,000 or less
 - Married filing jointly income of \$120,000 or less

Child and Dependent Care Credit

- Refundable credit for those who lived in the U.S.
 more than half the year and paid for the care of a qualifying individual in order to work or look for work
- Who is a qualifying individual?
 - o Dependent under the age of 13: OR
 - Spouse or dependent of any age who is incapable of self-care: AND
 - o Lived with you more than half the year

2021 COVID Relief

Stimulus checks

- First two stimulus checks must be claimed on a 2020 tax return
- The third stimulus check can be claimed on the 2021 tax return


Student loans

Charitable Deductions

- Can claim \$300 per person on top of standard deduction
 - Don't need to itemize

Unemployment Benefits

- In 2020 you could exclude up to \$10,200 of unemployment income
- ° This law is NO longer in effect

KANSAS REQUIREMENTS

2021 Kansas State Changes

- Increased standard deduction by \$500
 - Single= \$3,500
 - Head of Household= \$6,000
 - Married Filing Jointly= \$8,000
- Potential \$250 tax rebate for every Kansas resident filing a 2021 tax return
 - Proposed by Governor Kelly

Homestead Refund

- A rebate program for property taxes paid by homeowners with a maximum refund of \$700
 - Homestead is a house, mobile or manufactured home that is subject to general property taxes
- Requirements:
 - Kansas resident living in the state the entire year
 - Total household income less than \$36,300 or less
 - Meet one of the following:
 - Born before Jan. 1, 1966 OR
 - Totally & permanently disabled or blind during the entire year OR
 - Had a dependent child living with you all of last year who was born before Jan. 1, 2021 and was under the age of 18 the entire year

SAFESRKansas Property Tax Relief for Low Income Seniors

- 75% of 2021 general property tax paid or to be paid- as shown of the 2021 real estate tax statement for the residence in which the claimant lived in 2021.
 - No limits unlike the Homestead refund
- How to qualify:
 - Individual who is a Kansas resident that lives in Kansas for all of 2021
 - Owned and occupied a home in Kansas during 2021
 - Ades 65 years or older for all of 2021 (born before Jan. 1, 1966)
 - Household income of ~\$20,000
- o Can request to enroll in the Refund Advancement Program
- o Can only receive this OR the Homestead Property

Bank On Kansas City

- Bank on Certified Accounts are
 - Safe: do not allow overdraft or insufficient funds fees
 - Low Cost: are \$5 or less per month, with no unpredictable fees
 - Functional: all free deposits, free withdrawals, and free bill payments
