

## Possible Divorce Questions for Kansas Courts

*The following are the questions that you can use to guide your communication with the Court. You should **not** read the question out loud to the Judge. However, you can go use these questions to formulate your answers to the Judge. Some sample statements that you would make to the Court are contained below each question.*

1. Please state your name.

*My name is:*

2. Are you the petitioner in this action and are all the allegations contained in your papers true and correct?

*I am the Petitioner in this divorce action. All the statements in the papers I have filed with this Court are true.*

3. You have read the Journal Entry of Decree of Divorce, do you believe it to be fair, just and equitable?

*I have read the Journal Entry and believe it is fair, just and equitable.*

4. When you divided your debts and assets in the Journal Entry did you take into consideration the value of those items?

*When we divided the debts and the assets of this marriage, we took into consideration the value of the assets and the amount of each debt.*

5. You have made arrangements for the custody and parenting time of the minor children, do you believe those arrangements to be in the childrens' best interests?

*I believe that the arrangement's we have made for custody, parenting time and child support is in the best interest of the children.*

6. Are you seeking a divorce today on the grounds of incompatibility? Do you believe there is a chance of reconciliation?

*I am seeking a divorce on the grounds of incompatibility. I do not believe there is any chance of reconciling this marriage.*

Individual courts may ask other questions about your debts and the things you own. They will be focusing on the division of those things and whether it is fair.
